
"Nefertiti" necklace (Model #EG1003)





Materials needed:

I use Czech seed beads, usually size 11, but you can use size 8 as well. Since they are bigger, the necklace will be done faster, but it will be very wide as well.

You will need:

1 oz of basic color beads (they are black on the diagram), 1oz of accent beads (they are white on the diagram) and approximately 300 faceted beads

(the gray rhombus on the diagram) Needle

12 yd. of thread

Estimated time:

Depending on the size of beads you choose for this necklace and your experience, you should be able to complete this necklace in 6-10 hours.



Instructions:

Start by picking up beads according to pic.1 and continue beading. The result of the first 4 steps shown in the bordered picture

After step 7 repeat from step 2.

Continue beading until the desired length is reached

Tips:

Since tacking the end of the thread is a tedious job, I prefer starting my necklaces from the middle. I leave the thread on the spindle (you don't need to make a 'stoper' bead this way). When I am done with the first half, I come back to the middle part and continue from there.

This necklace is going to be about 3" wide (assuming you are using size 11). To reduce the width you can make the dangling ends shorter. You can remove the middle or the bottom part of them – and you will have a different necklace of your own design. Now you can see it's not that hard to design your own jewelry.
